We completed our first Unidirectional Flush this past spring, this allowed us to effectively remove sediment in the main distribution pipes. We have budgeted and began the repair of over 80 curb boxes in need of repair. I enjoy working with Mike and the Board continuing to make things better - and there are always things to make better.

As temperatures drop, here are some important safety tips to keep in mind:


