Clark, Schaefer, Hackett - Audit presentation:

There were no significant deficiencies or material weaknesses, and it was determined to be a clean audit. After a review with the Utility Board next week, the board expects to complete the audit with a formal sign-off.

The committee is looking into making changes to the Constitution regarding short-term rentals. It expects to present these changes for the property owners' vote at the October property owners' meeting.
